



CUSTOMER OWNED PIPING NOTIFICATION

Citizens Gas is responsible for maintaining the natural gas main buried in the street and the underground service line that runs up to the gas meter. We are also responsible for maintaining our gas meter that sits at your residence.

As a homeowner, you are responsible for maintaining any gas fuel piping installed past our gas meter. This includes natural gas piping buried between your house and any outlying buildings such as garages, workshops or barns.

If you have buried natural gas piping and it is not maintained, it may become a potential hazard due to corrosion or leakage. The piping should be periodically inspected.

If a safety hazard is found or if you smell natural gas, leave the house immediately and once outside, call our emergency line at 517-265-2144.

This notice is required by the Michigan Gas Safety Code for everyone's safety.

BEFORE YOU DIG

Whether you're planting a tree, installing a fence or doing any digging in your yard, always call MISS DIG at 811 before you dig. This free service will mark buried gas, water, electric and sewer lines so you can dig safely and without fear of service interruptions and costly repairs.

METER ACCESS

Access to our natural gas meter and shut off valve is imperative to performing periodic maintenance and help protect you and your home in the event of an emergency. The diagram below illustrates the minimum requirements we need to easily gain access to the gas meter set assembly. Make sure not to bury or cover the emergency shut off valve.
